  - District Highlights:
    - The Human Resources Department hosted a successful substitutes and tutors job fair.
    - The district launched its Teacher Incentive Allotment program.
    - District principals hosted a professional development day for their campus staff.

- The Student Support Services Department hosted its Red Ribbon Week Parent and Family Engagement night to raise awareness on drugs and drugs prevention.
- DeSoto ISD hosted its Veterans Day Tribute for all district and community veterans and their families.
- DeSoto ISD Superintendent Dr. D'Andre Weaver launched his superintendent advisory council sessions with parent, student, and staff stakeholder groups.
- DeSoto ISD was selected as a feature district on the WFAA Daybreak news broadcast.

### Student Highlights:

- Seven DeSoto High School Lady Eagles Basketball senior studentathletes signed their letters of intent during the National Early Signing Day and were included on the Dallas Morning News' top 20 high school Girls Basketball recruiting class of 2022.
- Two DeSoto High School Fine Arts Dance students were selected out of 1500 candidates to participate in the All-American Dance team in Honolulu, HI in the spring of 2022.
- The DHS Band earned straight 1's at the UIL Region 20 marching band competition which promoted the band to the UIL Area Marching Contest.
- Twenty-Four DeSoto ISD Middle School students from Curtistene McCowan Middle School and West Middle School earned placements in the All-District Middle School Honor Band on October 23, 2021. Students were selected by audition and earned the opportunity to work under the direction of a renowned clinician, Mr. Peter Ware, before participating in their first concert of the year under his direction.

- The DHS Choir Students received UIL Region Honors in the
  - UIL Region 20 All-District Choirs, the UIL Region 20 Honor Choir, the All-Region Choir, and the Pre-Area Round.
- Selected from among hundreds of choirs who submitted recordings across the United States, the DeSoto High School Acapella Choir has been invited to perform at the WorldStrides Choral Festival to be held in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- After a rigorous audition process that included 1500 candidates, two DHS Eaglettes were selected to participate in the HTE Dance Academy National Dance Team and will perform in Honolulu, Hawaii in March 2022, mingle with top college recruiters, and learn about the history and culture of the island.
- The DHS Choir has earned two incredible honors at the Southwest American Choir Directors Association Conference, which will be held in Little Rock, Arkansas on February 28-March 3, 2022.
  - Six DHS choir students have auditioned and earned placement in the SWACDA Honor Choir.
  - The DHS Varsity Ladies Choir was selected as the first ladies' demonstration honor choir to ever be selected for the event.
- Six DeSoto High School AP students who were recognized as National College Board Scholars took the PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, or AP Exams as a part of the National Recognition program for the following areas: African American, Hispanic, and Indigenous.
- The DeSoto High School Advanced Placement Program has experienced growth:

- Increase in the overall number of exams taken from 642 in 2020 to 804 2021
- Increase in student college readiness scores from 90 in 2020 to 119 2021
- Increase in qualifying scores for female students from 27 in 2020 to 32 2021
- Increase in the number of exams taken by African American students from 260 in 2020 to 595 in 2021
- Increase in total AP enrollment from 418 students in 2020 to 775 in 2021
- Students received qualifying scores for the first time in the following AP exam groups:
  - o 2D Art Design from 0 in 2020 to 2 2021 \* 3 and 5 scores
  - Environmental Science 0 2020 to 2 2021 \* 4 and 5 scores
