### **District Highlights:**

• In recognition of School Board Appreciation Month, DeSoto ISD celebrated its trustees with a small celebration and tokens of appreciation from the district staff, campus leaders, and its students with gratitude for their commitment to the theme, "RISING ABOVE" throughout the year.

- The DeSoto ISD Student Support Services Department held its Positive Behavior Intervention System (PBIS) workshop for parents and students to share strategies to support the school and home environments.
- The DeSoto Bilingual, ESL, and LOTE Department held a parent meeting to provide tools, information, and resources for its students and families.
- DeSoto ISD School Board President DeAndrea Fleming was recently awarded the Leadership ISD 'As One' Award during the organization's 10th-anniversary dinner.
- DeSoto ISD welcomed interim superintendent, Dr. Larry Lewis, to the district during its mid-year virtual convocation.
- DeSoto ISD launched its Teacher-in-Residence program to support the academic growth of its students.
- DeSoto ISD held its January Spring Career Expo to help bring more teachers, support staff, and volunteers to aid student growth and academic success. ### Student Highlights:

- DeSoto High School senior Devyn Bobby signed his letter of intent to attend Baylor University and play collegiate football for the Bears.
- DeSoto High School Girls Basketball team, the Lady Eagles, boasts seven nominees for the 2022 McDonald's All-American game. These scholars, average a 3.9 GPA in the classroom and are currently #2 in the nation.
- The DeSoto High School Eagle Band collected and donated \$700 to the KLTY Christmas Wish community giving program for a six-year total of \$2,700.
- Two DeSoto High School Fine Arts Choir students were selected to compete as finalists for the Texas Music Educators Association All-State Honors Choir and one

DeSoto High School student from the A Capella choir received the All-State Honors from TMEA.

- The DeSoto High School Varsity Ladies choir will perform at the Regional Workshop for the 2022 SWACDA "Together" Conference at the Marriott in Little Rock, Arkansas in March.
- Six DeSoto ISD students auditioned and were accepted in the Southwest American Choral Directors' Association Honors Choir. They will be performing in March at the Little Rock Statehouse Convention Center.
- In conjunction with the University of Hawaii, the DeSoto High School A Cappella Choir will be participating in the music festival with choirs from across the country and throughout the world at the Aloha State Choral Festival in March.
- Three Desoto ISD students were surprised with tuition scholarships to attend Prairie View A&M University totaling approximately \$174,000 over four years.
- A Cockrell Hill Elementary student, known as Chef Karter, recently joined DeSoto Mayor Rachel Proctor in a community video sharing his special holiday recipe.

### **Staff Highlights:**

• Through the district's recently launched Teacher Incentive Allotment (TIA) program, 30 DeSoto ISD teachers were surprised with checks between \$2,500 and \$10,000 and a special high-performance designation added to their state teaching credential.

  - Chief of Research, Evaluation, and Design Benjamin Mackey and Senior Data Strategist Josh Newton presented this annual report to the community.

 Two public comments on non-agenda items were received for this meeting regarding food service workers' compensation.

### Board Monitoring

 This monthly progress monitoring session is designed to discuss student and teacher progress in selected areas as it relates to the board's goals.
 Interim Superintendent Dr. Larry Lewis presented the district data along with potential solutions to meet the progress measures.

- This monitoring session centered on Board Goal 1: CCMR- College, Career & Military Readiness (GPMs 1.2 & 1.3).
- The District celebrated DeSoto High School and Early College High School students who passed the most dual credit courses during the fall semester.

### Superintendent Constraints

- This discussion centered on Constraint 5 (5.1, 5.2, 5.3): Culture Middle of the Year.
- Interim Superintendent Dr. Lewis presented this item and shared that the progress measure for students is slightly off track while the staff progress measure was met. He also sighted potential solutions to help meet and exceed the goal progress measures.

 Board President DeAndrea Fleming introduced this set of constraints that will govern how the superintendent and board will interact regarding the school district. During the meeting, the Board consented that this constraint has been upheld by all trustees.
